City of Colorado Springs Ballot Question 300

Shall the ordinances of the City of Colorado Springs be amended:

- To authorize only existing medical marijuana licensees to apply to become licensed as retail/recreational marijuana businesses, subject to all applicable taxes, including the existing 5% sales tax on retail/recreational marijuana to generate revenue for public safety programs, mental health services, and post-traumatic stress disorder treatment programs for veterans;
- To limit the number of retail/recreational marijuana licenses in Colorado Springs so that the number of licensed locations cannot exceed the number of existing medical marijuana licenses on November 6, 2024; and
- To codify violations and pensities for retail/recreational marijuans, which cannot be amended except by a vote of the people, in the Coloredo Springs City Code Including regulations that:
